Harmony Day Picnic Details - more information will be coming home in the next few days.


When: Feb. 15 @ 10:15 (Primary) and 11:45 (Intermediate)



### TRAFFIC SAFETY ADVISORY

We request that families and care providers consider the following:

#### It is illegal to:

Drive through a marked crosswalk when it is occupied by pedestrians.
 As you approach a crosswalk, scan both ends and stop if occupied. Try to make eye contact with the pedestrian.

Park or stop on any marked crosswalk or within 6 m of the approach side of a crosswalk. If you do, you are in contravention of Traffic Bylaw 98-186. Parking on the crosswalk forces young children to attempt to cross the road elsewhere and puts them at risk to be hit by a vehicle.

- Make a U-turn if it interferes with other traffic.
- Park across the entrance to a driveway or intersection.
- Park where a curb is painted yellow.



#### Other reminders:

- The driveway and parking lot in front of the school is closed to all traffic except staff, fire, and vehicles equipped with a handicap pass.
- Use the 'Kiss & Go' lane, but do not park there! Follow the yellow arrows and drop-off in the upper level at the end of the drive-through. Do not stop at the start or middle. NEW: The four vehicles at the top of the Kiss and Go lane can let their children exit at the same time as there is a sidewalk along the lane four vehicles deep. This would help move the line a little faster.
- Safely walking, cycling, riding scooters and skateboards require continuous reinforcement both at home and at school. This equipment is not to be used on school property until after 2:45 pm.
- A reminder to parents that there are lots of students out and about during peak drop off and pick up times and we urge you to use extra caution while driving.
- Also, parents are asked to use the sidewalks if walking their children to and from school and not to cut through the parking lot as it is not safe.

All 8 jurisdictions that have been identified for this phase of the work (US, UK, Estonia, Finland, Singapore, Germany, Australia and BC- not Canada) have been tasked with asking a small parent group of 15 people their thoughts on the attached questions. The Ministry is hoping to hear from parents from different regions, diversity characteristics, and perspectives across the province. This is clearly not a scientific study but does give some thoughts on the multinational project regarding how folks feel about these issues. No personal attributions will be made.

(for kindergarten, new students, and Programs of Choice for K - 12)

Schools will be open at 7:00 am to provide telephone support to parents that require assistance.

Documentation Submission Deadline: Friday, March 17, 2023

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Please contact your school for assistance.

Online applications begin on Monday, January 30, 2023 at 7:00 am. Applications will be assigned a datetime stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by Friday, March 17, 2023.

- Student's Birth Certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
  - a. Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
  - b. BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of supporting documentation below; or,
  - c. Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of supporting documentation below.
- 3. Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address/Supporting Documentation
  - Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
  - Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
  - British Columbia registration of an automobile;
  - British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
  - A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.

#### AFTER Thursday, August 31, 2023

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will receive a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2023, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2023. No exceptions.
