

TRAFFIC SAFETY ADVISORY

We request that families and care providers consider the following:

It is illegal to:

Drive through a marked crosswalk when it is occupied by pedestrians.
 As you approach a crosswalk, scan both ends and stop if occupied. Try to make eye contact with the pedestrian.

Park or stop on any marked crosswalk or within 6 m of the approach side of a crosswalk. If you do, you are in contravention of Traffic Bylaw 98-186. Parking on the crosswalk forces young children to attempt to cross the road elsewhere and puts them at risk of being hit by a vehicle.

PERMITTED
ON
CROSSWALK

- Make a U-turn if it interferes with other traffic.
- Park across the entrance to a driveway or intersection.
- Park where a curb is painted yellow.

Other reminders:

- The driveway and parking lot in front of the school is closed to all traffic except staff, fire, and vehicles equipped with a handicap pass.
- Safely walking, cycling, riding scooters and skateboards require continuous reinforcement both at home and at school. This equipment is not to be used on school property until after 2:45 pm.
- A reminder to parents that there are lots of students out and about during peak drop off and pick
 up times and we urge you to use extra caution while driving.
- Also, parents are asked to use the sidewalks if walking their children to and from school and not to cut through the parking lot as it is not safe.
